Soap Operas

The soap opera is a classic British television series. The most famous ones include 'Coronation Street' and 'Eastenders'. They show about three episodes a week. The characters become household names and the series often tackle difficult issues (such as alcoholism) to make it more 'realistic'.

'Doctor Who' is a science fiction series for children that first appeared on TV screens in 1963 and ran until 1989. It was revived in 2005 and since then three famous actors have taken on the role of 'The Doctor' – Christopher Eccleston, David Tennant and Matt Smith. The Doctor is a Time Lord who travels through time and space with a female companion, having adventures and meeting many terrifying enemies.
